

Visitors' Rules of Conduct

Welcome to Kunstmuseum Bonn. Before visiting the museum, we would like to acquaint you with our rules of conduct.

Our supervisory staff is there to help you and to answer your questions. Please follow our staff's instructions at any time. Violation of any of the following instructions or any other interference in the museum's operating procedure may result in an order to leave the museum.

Please **leave animals and bicycles outside** the museum. **Outerwear**, large **handbags** (any size over 40 x 30 cm), briefcases, backpacks and **bulky items** (e.g. umbrellas) are to be left at the coatroom. We accept no liability for your **valuables**, so please make sure to remove money, checks and jewelry before checking any items in the coatroom.

During your visit, we ask you to behave in an appropriate and considerate way. **Smoking, eating and drinking are not permitted.** Please keep **a minimum distance of 60 cm** to the artworks. Please refrain from touching any objects or display cabinets and do not handle any items in the exhibition spaces that could damage the artworks. Only pencils are allowed to be used in the exhibition spaces. Please bear in mind that you will be held liable for any damages you may cause.

Teachers, group leaders and parents or guardians must accompany and supervise children and juveniles at any time and see to their appropriate behavior.

You have **permission to photograph** (without flashlight) and **film** artworks for private use, academic study, and news coverage (press). All other purposes require special permission granted against the payment of a fee. Out of consideration for other visitors and in order to protect the artworks, the use of flashbulbs, handheld floodlights or tripods is only allowed in exceptional cases and requires special permission.

Kunstmuseum Bonn reserves its right to give further orders in individual cases to prevent any interruptions in the museum's operating procedure.
